The intention is that the fees structure should be clear and straightforward, avoiding wherever possible the levying of charges for services and activities as "extras". This ensures that the costs of each term's education will be known in advance, with no additions of which parents are unaware.

#### **The following are included in the Standard Fee:**

**activities** which form part of the curriculum: **books and stationery** supporting the curriculum and most **materials** required for Art and CDT: **career profiling**, a professional assessment designed to quantify the skills and aptitudes of pupils in Years 11 and 6[1] and provide detailed guidance regarding future careers and university courses: copies of the **Kent College Times** sent free of charge to each household: **exam fees** for entering pupils at GCSE or their first A/S and A2 examinations in the 6<sup>th</sup> Form, and international students for their first English examinations at various levels: all meals for boarding pupils and **lunches** for day pupils: **personal accident insurance** for pupils: **all bedding** and internal **laundry** services for boarders: **trips** which are designated by the school to be obligatory in support of the curriculum e.g. Science and Technology Week, theatre visits, and geography field trips: and costs associated with representing the school in designated **sports fixtures and events**. A contribution will be required for residential trips.

**Payment of fees** is due on the first day of each term, as printed on the fees invoice: details of **schemes for phased payment** of fees by Standing Order or Direct Debit are available on request.

Overseas Pupils wishing to take either a GCSE or 'A' Level in their native language can do so by accessing group coaching sessions outside timetabled lessons. The fees for the additional sessions, held in the Summer Term - £21.00 per hour.

### Extras

The costs of the following services and activities will be put on the fees account as extras with the prior authority of parents:

**books** which remain the personal property of the pupil (library/text books which are lost may also be charged); the cost of the daily **coach and minibuss** services for day pupils: School Fees, Private Health **insurance** and Denplan arranged by the school, with parents being able to opt out: individual **music** tuition/hire of musical instruments: expenditure incurred by pupils in the **College Shop**: the cost of participation in certain **specialist sports** e.g. judo and riding: the costs, which are usually subsidised by the College, of **special trips** e.g. additional trips to the theatre. Contributions will also be required for Residential Trips.

### Scholarships, Bursaries and Remissions

#### **Scholarships, Bursaries Remissions:**

The percentage fee reduction awarded will be applied to the day tuition fee only. The inclusive fee consists of a tuition fee and a facilities fee. The tuition fees for the academic year 2011/12 are:-

#### **Sibling Bursaries:**

When three or more children from the same family are attending Kent College simultaneously, the following remissions may be granted:

Third Child	20% bursary
Fourth and additional Children	40% bursary

This bursary is given in respect of the youngest child/children. It is not given in addition to any other award, and is not available for children in the Nursery Unit.

**HM Forces Bursaries:** personnel who are eligible for the Boarding School Allowance are eligible for a 90% remission of the total boarding and tuition fee.
